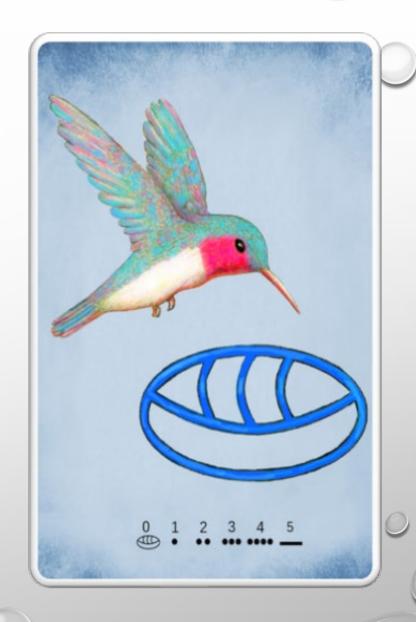

## ADDRESSING EDUCATION GAPS

ENTRENCHED FALSE NARRATIVE: TO SUCCEED ALL STUDENTS HAVE TO DO IS PULL THEMSELVES UP BY THE BOOTSTRAPS AND SUCCEED ON THEIR OWN WITH MINIMAL TO NO SUPPORT.

COUNTER-STORY: RELATIONSHIPS, VALIDATION, CARING AND EMPATHY ARE CRITICAL TO SUCCESS, ESPECIALLY FOR FIRST-GENERATION, LOW-INCOME STUDENTS. THIS IS ESPECIALLY TRUE IN THE PERIOD OF A PANDEMIC.

NEW BOOK: RELATIONSHIP-RICH EDUCATION (FELTEN & LAMBERT, 2020). HUMAN CONNECTIONS DRIVE SUCCESS.

**ACTION: WORK WITH A VALIDATION-RICH ACADEMIC AND STUDENT SUPPORT SYSTEM.**

- HELPS STUDENTS TO FEEL THAT THEY MATTER AND THAT THEY ARE VALUED!

- FACULTY AND STUDENT AFFAIRS STAFF WORK WITH AN ETHIC OF CARE THAT FOSTERS A SENSE OF BELONGING.
- VALIDATE STUDENT VOICE.
- HELP STUDENTS BELIEVE IN THEMSELVES / I CAN DO THIS!

### **VALIDATION AND ONLINE EXPERIENCES**

- RESEARCH SHOWS THAT ONLINE LEARNING WORKS BEST WHEN
  FACULTY BUILD REGULAR, POSITIVE, AND INTERACTIVE
  RELATIONSHIPS WITH STUDENTS (99 TIPS FOR CREATING SIMPLE AND
  SUSTAINABLE EDUCATIONAL VIDEOS--COSTA & PACANSKY-BROCK,
  2020)
- SHOW UP NOT JUST AS AN FACULTY OR STAFF, BUT AS A HUMAN BEING
  - CONVEY CARING AND SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS
  - PRAISE SUCCESS
  - VALIDATE THEIR ABILITY TO BE SUCCESSFUL
  - BE REASSURING
  - REMAIN ACCESSIBLE
  - USE VIDEOS TO CAPTURE YOUR CARING AND EMPATHY
  - LET STUDENTS KNOW YOU ARE AWARE OF THEIR SITUATIONS DURING THIS DIFFICULT TIME (DARBY,

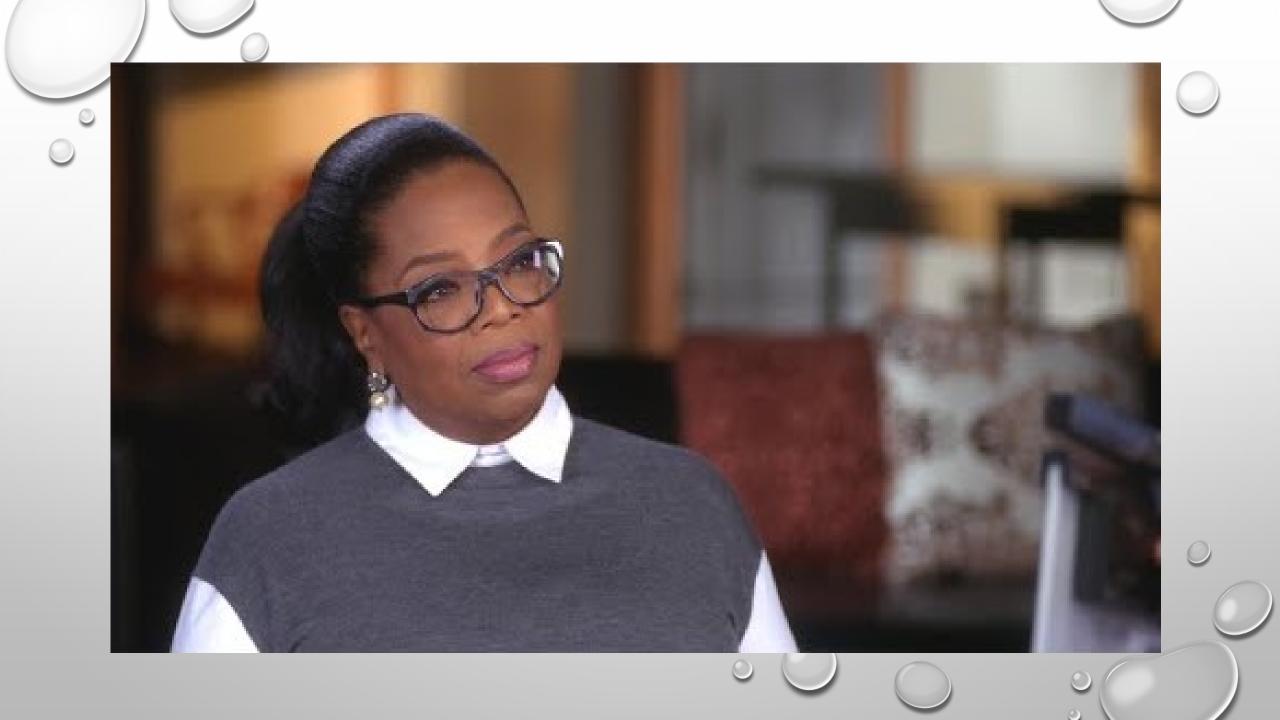

- BELIEVE IN INHERENT CAPACITY TO LEARN SEP
- BECOME EXCITED ABOUT LEARNING

  SEP.
- FEEL A PART OF THE LEARNING COMMUNITY SEP
- BECOME MOTIVATED OR DRIVEN SEP
- FEEL CARED ABOUT AS A PERSON, NOT JUST A STUDENT
- POST ON CHAT FUNCTION:
- WHO HAS BEEN YOUR VALIDATING AGENT?
- HOW DID THAT VALIDATING AGENT MAKE YOU FEEL?

# THE COLLEGE EXPERIENCE FOR FIRST-GENERATION, LOW-INCOME STUDENTS

- FALSE NARRATIVES: THE COLLEGE EXPERIENCE IS TYPICALLY THE SAME FOR ALL STUDENTS,

  ALL OF THEM CAN BE TREATED THE SAME WAY.
- <u>COUNTER STORY</u>: THE LIFE AND COLLEGE EXPERIENCES OF FIRST-GENERATION, LOW-INCOME STUDENTS ARE NOT THE SAME AS WEALTHY, PRIVILEGED STUDENTS.
- <u>ACTION</u>: UNDERSTAND THE DISTINCT DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE COLLEGE EXPERIENCE OF WEALTHY, PRIVILEGED STUDENTS AND FIRST-GENERATION, LOW-INCOME STUDENTS.

## FIRST-GENERATION STUDENTS—7 FACTS (EAB, 2018)

- 1. MORE LIKELY TO ATTEND A COMMUNITY COLLEGE
- 2. LESS LIKELY TO GRADUATE ON TIME
- 3. CHOOSE CAREERS THAT GIVE BACK TO THEIR COMMUNITIES
- 4. EARN LESS THAN THEIR PEERS
- 5. LESS LIKELY TO HAVE A MENTOR
- 6. NEED MORE FINANCIAL SUPPORT
- 7. MAY NOT KNOW THEY ARE FIRST GENERATION—MAY LOSE OUT ON RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR THEM

# RESEARCH PROJECT: THE COLLEGE EXPERIENCE FOR LATINX STUDENTS AT UTSA

#### PURPOSE

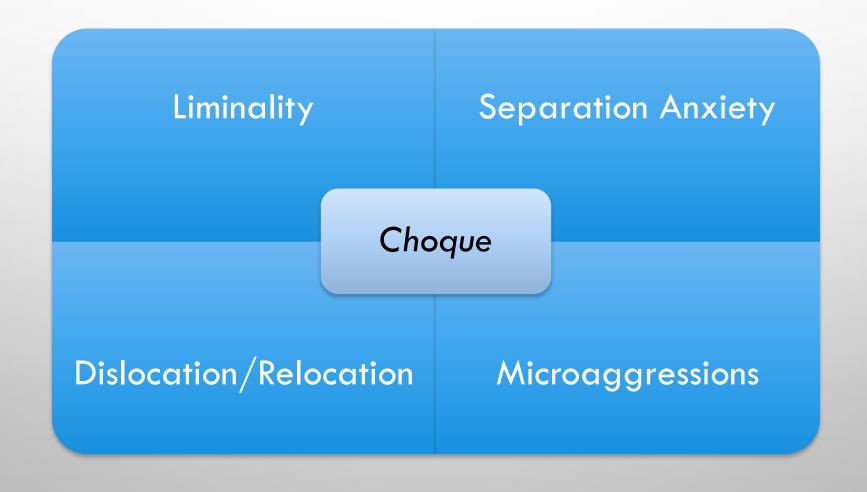

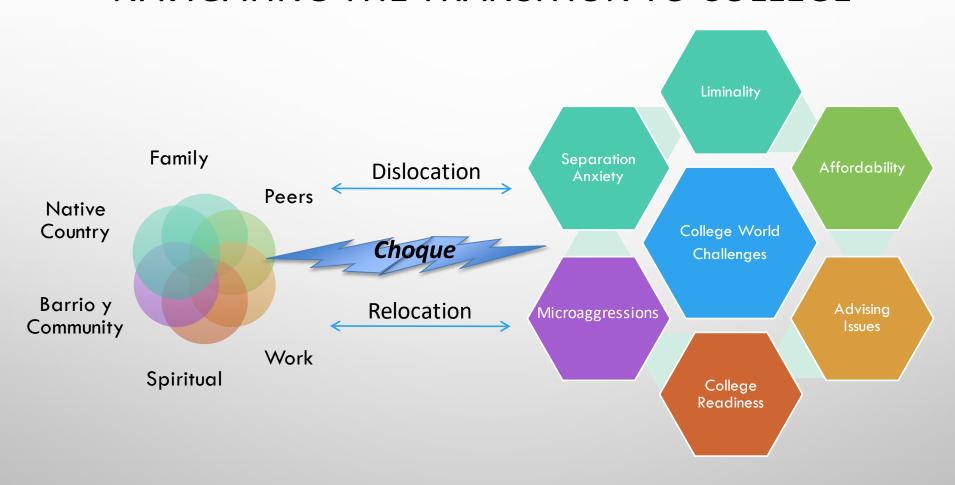

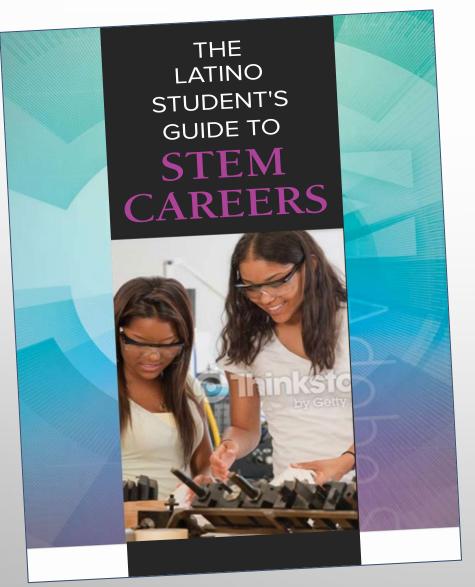


# THE IMPORTANCE OF WORKING EFFECTIVELY WITH UNDERSERVED STUDENTS: RECOGNIZING AND LEVERAGING STUDENT STRENGTHS

ENTRENCHED FALSE NARRATIVE: LOW-INCOME STUDENTS ARE NOT THE BEST CANDIDATES FOR STEM EDUCATION AND STEM CAREERS.

COUNTER-STORY: LOW-INCOME STUDENTS CAN SUCCEED IN STEM WHEN GIVEN THE PROPER SUPPORT AND RESOURCES.

ACTION: WORK WITH AN ASSET-BASED FRAMEWORK. RECOGNIZE THAT UNDERSERVED STUDENTS HAVE FORMIDABLE STRENGTHS THAT NEED TO BE VALIDATED AND LEVERAGED.



#### **RESEARCH QUESTIONS:**

1.WHAT IS THE EXPERIENCE OF LATINX STUDENTS WHO HAVE GAINED ACCESS TO AND COMPLETED A STEM DEGREE (I.E., CHALLENGES FACED, HELPFUL LEARNING EXPERIENCES, SOURCES OF SUPPORT AND ENCOURAGEMENT, ETC.)?

2. WHAT WERE THE CONTRIBUTING PERSONAL ATTRIBUTES, ACADEMIC/SOCIAL/CULTURAL FACTORS AND COLLEGIATE EXPERIENCES THAT PROPELLED LATINX STUDENTS TO SUCCESSFULLY EARN A STEM DEGREE?

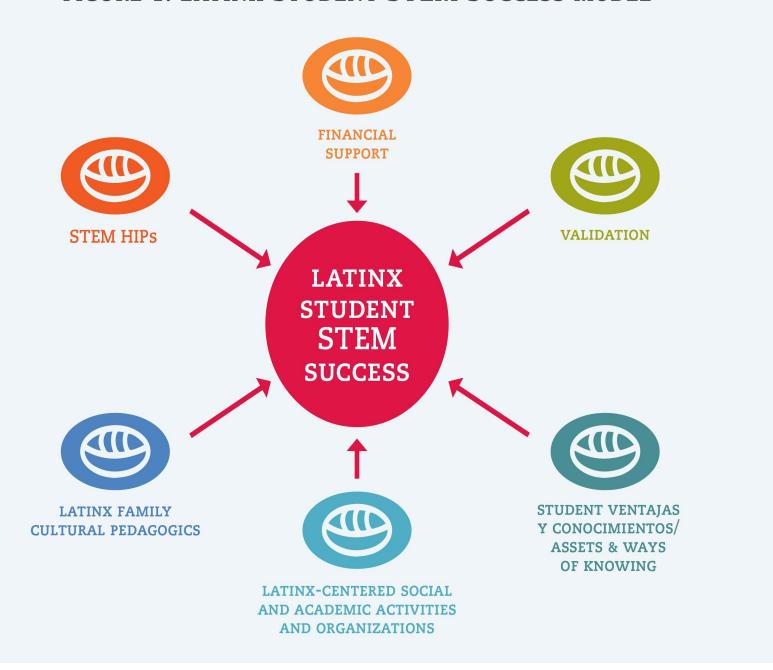

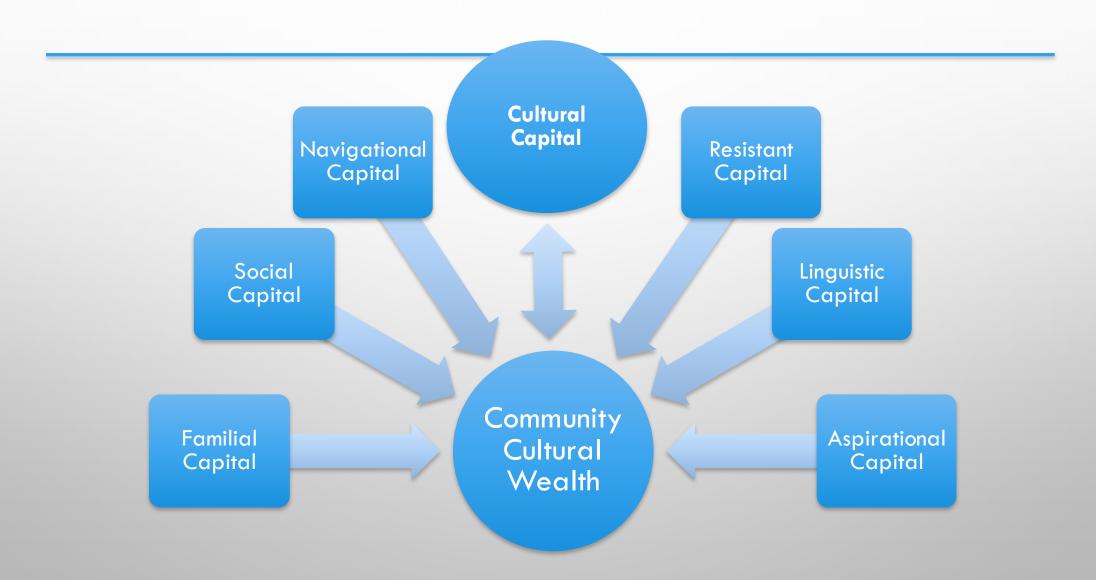

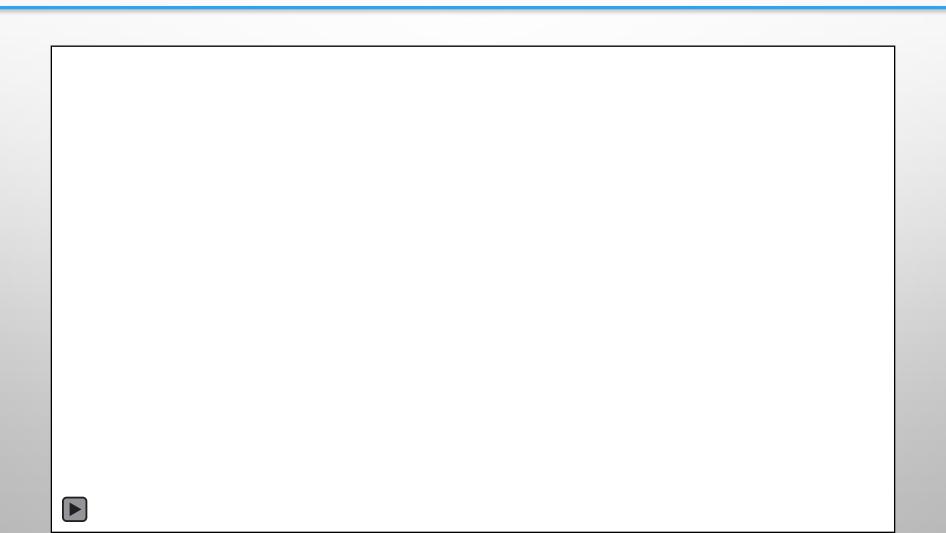

# THE IMPORTANCE OF WORKING EFFECTIVELY WITH STUDENTS EMPLOYING HOLISTIC APPROACHES & DEEP LEARNING EXPERIENCES

ENTRENCHED FALSE NARRATIVE: ALL THAT FACULTY NEED TO BE CONCERNED WITH ARE INTELLECTUAL PURSUITS (I.E., CONTENT MASTERY, CRITICAL THINKING AND PROBLEM-SOLVING SKILLS).

COUNTER-STORY: ATTENTION TO EDUCATING THE WHOLE PERSON, DESIGNING CULTURALLY-RESPONSIVE PEDAGOGY AND ENGAGING STUDENTS IN DEEP LEARNING EXPERIENCES CAN LEVERAGE ASSETS SUCH AS GIVING BACK AND SERVE TO INSPIRE STUDENTS.

ACTION: CREATE A CULTURALLY-VALIDATING PEDAGOGY WHICH ADDRESSES THE WHOLE PERSON AND THAT FOSTERS CONTEMPLATIVE, DEEP LEARNING EXPERIENCES

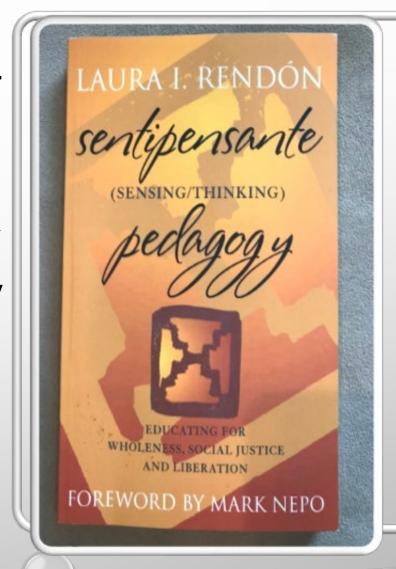
## IMPORTANT STUDENT OUTCOMES. HOW CAN WE BEST DEVELOP THESE COMPETENCIES?

- <u>DEEP SELF KNOWLEDGE</u>. ALL THAT WE ARE AND REPRESENT, INTERSECTING IDENTITIES, EXPLORATION OF THE LIGHT AND SHADOWS OF OUR EXISTENCE SUCH AS INTERNALIZED RACISM AND HOMOPHOBIA, AGGRESSION, SELF-AGGRANDIZEMENT.
- PLURIVERSALITY. ABILITY TO FUNCTION FROM SPACETHAT GOES BEYOND "EITHER/OR THINKING" TO EMBRACE "BOTH/AND" PERSPECTIVES. ABILITY TO SEE NOT JUST TWO REALITIES, BUT MULTIPLE REALITIES. HAVING ONLY TWO CHOICES CAN DIVIDE PEOPLE (ANDREOTTI, AHENAKEW, & COOPER, G., 2011; MIGNOLO, 2013).
- BUILD COMMUNITY. ABILITY TO REACH OUT TO OTHERS, EMBRACE DIVERSE PERSPECTIVES, FORM CONSENSUS AND WORK TOWARD THE COMMON GOOD.
- <u>CRITICAL CONSCIOUSNESS</u>. ABILITY TO IDENTIFY INEQUITIES AND INJUSTICES AND TAKE ACTION TO ADDRESS THEM.
- <u>EMPATHY</u>. ABILITY TO EMPATHIZE, TO STEP INTO THE WORLD OF "THE OTHER" WITH RESPECT AND DIGNITY.
- COMPASSION. AUTHENTIC CARING AND CONCERN FOR OTHERS.

- APPRECIATE & WORK WITH DIVERSITY. ABILITY TO EMBRACE DIVERSE VIEWS, WORK IN A CONTEXT OF MULTICULTURALISM, AND EMPLOY DIVERSE WAYS OF KNOWING.
- SELF-CARE, HEALING AND WELL-BEING. ABILITY TO
  ATTEND TO SELF-CARE AND TO MAINTAIN WELL-BEING—
  SOCIAL JUSTICE WORK CAN CAUSE TRAUMA; NEED TO
  HEAL, REST AND REPLENISH.
- <u>CONNECTEDNESS</u>. OUR RELATIONSHIP TO "THE OTHER." THE I IS ABOUT THE WE. OUR STRUGGLES AND PAIN ARE INTERTWINED. EVERYTHING AFFECTS SOMETHING ELSE.
- PRESENCE. BEING AWARE AND PRESENT IN THE MOMENT.
- SENSE OF MEANING AND PURPOSE. DEEP INTROSPECTION TO REVEAL THE TRUTH OF ONE'S BEING.

# SENTIPENSANTE (SENSING/THINKING) PEDAGOGY

- A CULTURALLY-VALIDATING, DEEP LEARNING EXPERIENCE THAT ADDRESSES THE RHYTHMIC CONNECTION BETWEEN INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENT AND ASPECTS OF OUR HUMANITY.
- TO FOSTER DEEP LEARNING <u>ILLUMINATIVE KNOWLEDGE TOOLS</u>
   ARE EMPLOYED TO OPEN THE SENSES. EXAMPLES: PERIODS OF
   SILENCE, MUSIC, POETRY, ARTS-BASED PROJECTS, TESTIMONIOS,
   RITUAL, CULTURAL IMMERSIONS, DANCE, PRAYER, ALTARS,
   CULTURAL HEALING PRACTICES, ETC.
- ILLUMINATIVE KNOWLEDGE TOOLS ARE CAREFULLY SELECTED FOR STUDENTS TO DEVELOP COMPETENCIES THAT GO BEYOND INTELLECTUAL UNDERSTANDINGS TO INCLUDE, FOR EXAMPLE, SENSE OF MEANING & PURPOSE, EMPATHY, SELF KNOWLEDGE, PLURIVERSALITY, AND CRITICAL CONSCIOUSNESS.
- ALLOWS STUDENTS TO ENGAGE IN LEARNING PROJECTS THAT CONNECT PEDAGOGY TO EQUITY AND JUSTICE.

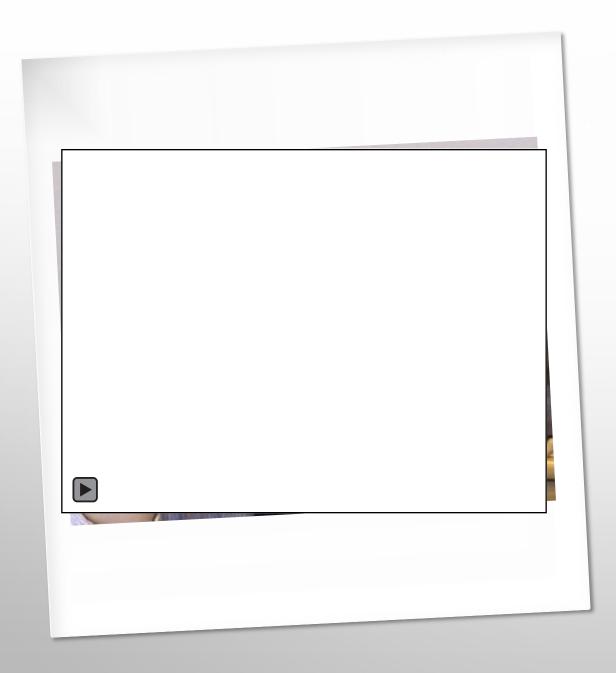

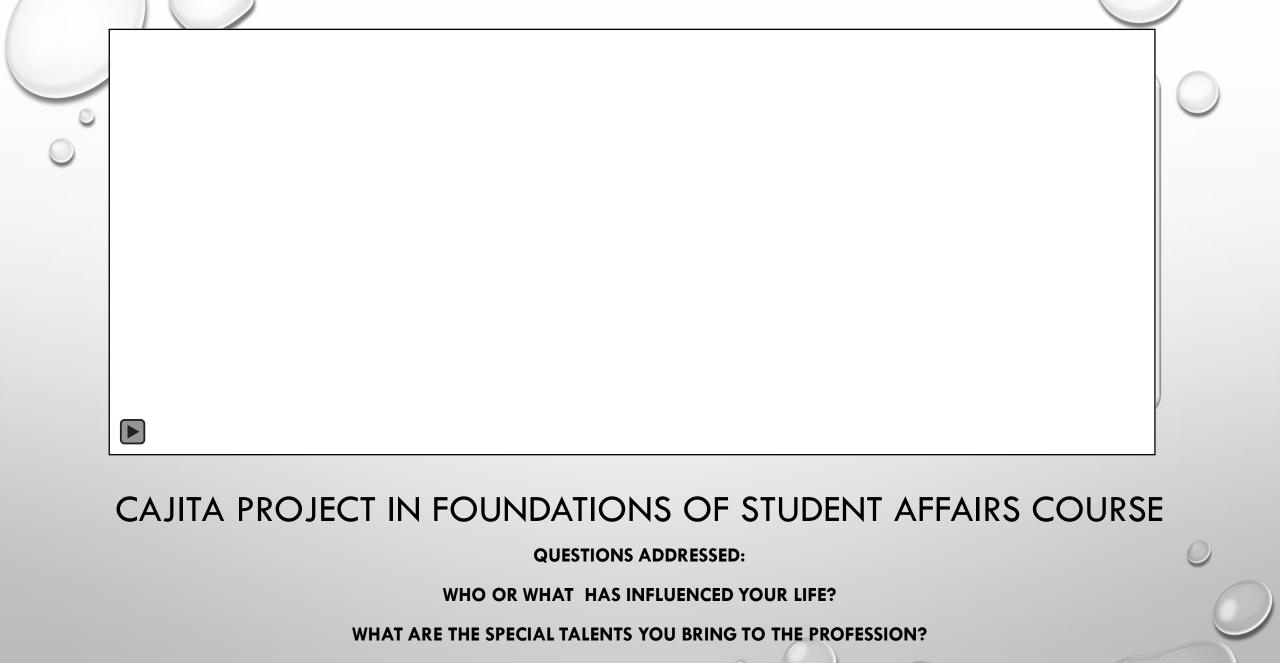

#### **ONLINE CAJITAS PROJECT**

- PHOTOGRAPHY—HAVE STUDENTS CONSTRUCT THEIR CAJITAS AND TAKE A PHOTO TO SHARE WITH CLASS
- DIGITAL STORYTELLING—HAVE STUDENTS CONSTRUCT THEIR CAJITAS AND DO A VIDEO ABOUT THE STORY OF THE CAJITA
- ASK STUDENTS IF THEY WOULD LIKE TO VOLUNTEER SHARING THEIR CAJITAS WITH THEIR PEERS
- ASK STUDENTS TO WRITE AN ESSAY OR A POEM ABOUT THEIR CAJITA
- ASK STUDENTS TO SHARE THEIR EXPERIENCE CONSTRUCTING A CAJITA. HOW DID IT EMERGE?
