

History

Westchester Community College was founded in 1946 as the New York State Institute of Applied Arts and Sciences in White Plains. In 1957, the County of Westchester bought the 360-acre John Hartford estate in Valhalla and designated 218 acres for the community college.

Enrollment

There are approximately 13,000 full- and part-time college credit students. Continuing education students bring the total number served by the college each semester to more than 24,000. Precise statistics about the college's enrollment history can be found in the Institutional Research, Planning & Effectiveness pages.

Accreditation

Westchester Community College is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, 3624 Market Street, Philadelphia, PA 19104. (267-284-5000). The Middle States Commission on Higher Education is an institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation. www.msche.org

- The Paralegal Studies degree program is approved by the American Bar Association.
- The Radiologic Technology A.A.S. degree program is accredited by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT).
- The Respiratory Care A.A.S. degree program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Respiratory Care (CoARC).
- The Veterinary Technology A.A.S. degree program is accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA).
- The AAS degree program in Dietetic Technician is no longer accepting students into the program. Effective June 15, 2021, the A.A.S. degree program in Dietetic Technician will not be accredited by ACEND.
- The associate nursing program at Westchester Community College has been granted initial accreditation by the Board of Commissioners of the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). The effective date for initial accreditation of the associate nursing program is May 24, 2017 with the next evaluation visit scheduled for Spring 2025.

Faculty

Westchester Community College's faculty and professional staff have received more SUNY Chancellors Awards for Excellence than any other community college in the system. More than 98% hold masters or doctorate degrees in their fields. Student/faculty ratio is 16:1.

Veteran Friendly Campus

The college, which opened in 1946 in order to train and educate veterans, welcomes those who have served our country. We are considered a "Veteran Friendly Campus" due to our extensive services for those who have spent time in the military.

Degrees

The college offers more than 60 associate and certificate programs. We have three types of associate degrees in 36 subject areas: the Associate in Arts for students transferring to four-year institutions in the liberal arts; the Associate in Science for those transferring to four-year institutions for business, math, science or health careers; and the Associate in Applied Science for those preparing to seek immediate employment, change careers or

transfer. In addition, certificate programs typically requiring between 15 to 33 credits are offered in approximately 20 career fields.

Continuing Education

The Continuing Education Division (Workforce Development and Community Education) is the largest such unit in the entire SUNY system. It offers courses for people of all ages considering career choices or changes or personal development; customized training for businesses; innovative programming for older adults; an exciting arts and culture series open to the public.

Financial Aid

Financial Aid is available to students who qualify. In addition, the Westchester Community College Foundation offers \$1.6 million in scholarships annually. Nearly one third of Westchester Community College students receive some form of financial aid.

Library

The Harold L. Drimmer Library / Learning Resource Center contains 198,000 volumes and 600 periodical titles, as well as more than 19 million searchable records and entries from 97 electronically-linked libraries.

Career & Transfer Center

The Career & Transfer Center helps students assess career options, plan career and curriculum, take steps toward transfer to a four-year college, prepare for job interviews, and locate and obtain jobs before and after graduation.

Child Care

Virginia Marx Children's Center at Westchester Community College (Valhalla campus) provides year-round, fully licensed and accredited care for children of students, faculty, staff and other working parents. Ages six weeks – five years.

Athletics

Intercollegiate teams for men are Baseball, Soccer, Cross Country, Bowling, Golf, Basketball. Women's intercollegiate teams include Softball, Volleyball, Cross Country, Bowling, Golf, Basketball. The Westchester Community College Fitness Center provides access to cardiovascular equipment, universal, nautilus, and light free weights, pool, and tennis courts. College athletics also include intramural sports and ESports.

Locations (Extension Centers & Additional Locations)

Main campus in Valhalla, Mount Vernon Center, Ossining Center, Peekskill Center, White Plains Center, Yonkers Cross County Center, Lakeland High School, Mahopac High School, Port Chester Middle School, Roosevelt High School, and The Ursuline School.

Center for Academic Counseling and Student Success

The Center for Academic Counseling and Student Success provides a variety of services in order to aid student success. Personal, career and educational goals are identified and discussed through one-on-one Counseling. Academic Counselors are available days and evenings, on campus and at extension sites.

Personal Counseling Department

The Personal Counseling Department creates a campus environment that is safe, growth fostering, and prioritizes the psychological, social, and emotional well-being of our college community.

The Personal Counseling Department offers confidential, individual and group mental health services in addition to campus-wide programming, intended to provide support, education, and healthy ways of coping with stressors and struggles.

Academic Support Center

The goal of the Academic Support Center is to help students become successful, confident, independent learners. The ASC provides ongoing tutorial assistance for students taking remedial/developmental and college courses in Math, Reading, ESL, Science, Physics, Computer Science, and Writing.

TRIO Student Support Services

TRIO/Student Support Services is a nationally recognized Student Support Services Program sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education. TRIO is dedicated to student success and will assist students in achieving their academic goals at Westchester Community College. TRIO assists low-income, first generation and/or disabled students to graduate and transfer to a four-year college. TRIO selects motivated and conscientious students who will participate in the program activities and are in need of assistance and/or support services.

Disability Services

Services for Students with Disabilities parallels the mission of Westchester Community College: to be accessible, community-centered, comprehensive, adaptable, and dedicated to lifelong learning and student success. Full participation for students with disabilities is encouraged.








