

2023 Native Perennial of the Year



Mertensia virginica

Virginia bluebells

The pink buds of this favorite spring ephemeral open to showy skyblue flowers in early spring. The rounded leaves are blue-green when they appear, often in March. Dormant by mid-summer, so pair with ferns or other later emerging plants. Early nectar source for bees.

Hardiness: Zones 3–8 Light: Part shade

Soil: Moist to average

Size: 8–16" tall

Foliage: Rounded blue-

green leaves

Flowers: Arching racemes of pink

buds open to blue flowers

Fruit: Brown nutlets

Bloom Time: March to April

Wildlife Value: The flowers attract

pollinators, including bumblebees, butterflies, moths, and hummingbirds. Deer resistant.
