President Miles gave updates on the following:

## Center for Academic Excellence in Cybersecurity.

Mr. Bob Wiener has been one of our most generous scholarship donors over the years. In addition to his \$200,000 annual scholarships, he has made an extraordinary grant of \$1 million to name the College's first Center of Excellence in Cybersecurity.

Last week, Professor John Watkins and team created a virtual event so that Mr. Wiener could meet the first cohort of Wiener Cyber Scholars, top performing students in the Cybersecurity program.

#### PTK Induction

WCC's Alpha Iota Omicron chapter has 364 new members and celebrated its Fall Induction Ceremony last week.

Our chapter was honored with 3 awards at the 2020 Phi Theta Kappa Annual Convention: Distinguished College Project; Distinguished Advisor- Tiago Machado; and Distinguished Chapter Officer- Brandon Fernandez.

Fall 2020 College Project was focused on promoting voter registration, the history of voting rights, and voter suppression.
