Student Excellence

- Vassar Exploring Transfer Program three WCC students have been invited to participate this summer: Blake Carrasco, Emilio-Jose Torres, and Ingrid White Kawiec.
- 2nd Annual Commitment Day: this Friday at 10 AM. Welcome newest Vikings to WCC so far, over 1,000 students have committed to attend WCC as their college of choice for fall 2022. On Friday, we will welcome over 300 students to our college community during a remote celebration of Commitment Day. Important step to building connection to the college.

Class of 2022

- 975 students applied for Spring or Summer 2022 graduation. (811 spring / 164 summer).
- Valedictorian Paola Beber Sanches has been awarded a 2022 Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship and is WCC's 12th Cooke Scholar! She is part of the JCK Foundation's biggest cohort yet, with 100 scholars from across the nation selected this year to receive this very prestigious scholarship.
 Recipients receive up to \$55,000 per year toward tuition, living expenses, books, and required fees to complete their bachelor's degree. Paola is considering NYU among other schools for the fall.
- Salutatorian Liam Murphy is considering Columbia and Yale for fall.

Class of 2021

- Institutional Research, Planning & Effectiveness is completing its 2020-2021
 Study of Graduates a few details from that report include:
- 76.3% of the survey respondents felt WCC prepared them well for further study
- 71% of the survey respondents felt that their experience at WCC enabled them to be well prepared or somewhat prepared for their current job
- 26.5% reported working full- or part-time in a job related to their degree or certificate.

• 26% of the survey respondents report earning \$50,000 or more/year.

IR's Fast Facts 2021 is now published online

- Even through pandemic challenges, students persisted.
- 1,801 degrees were granted in 2020-2021. 122 more than in 2019-2020.
- Student Success Story:
 - 24.5% Graduated Within Three Years
 - o 13.7% Transferred to Another College without Graduating
 - 38.2% Total Graduated or Transferred
 - o 54.6% Total success story for 2018 Cohort

WHEREAS, Westchester Community College's primary mission is teaching and learning, for which the main purpose of its facilities is for instructional activities, co-curricular programs, and student services; and

WHEREAS, occasionally spaces on campus may be unoccupied for college business and subsequently available for use by community organizations and external entities; and

WHEREAS, partnerships with external entities may result in opportunities to advance the mission of the college and its visibility in the community; and

WHEREAS, hosting an external entity may impose the need for additional facility maintenance and security to keep facilities in pristine condition and coordinating facility use by external entities requires administrative and staff oversight of a facility use program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Westchester Community College adopt the attached policy on facility use by external entities; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Westchester Community College adopt the attached fee schedule for facility use effective September 1, 2022 until August 31, 2023.
