Watkins, as the Curriculum Chair of the Cybersecurity program at SUNY Westchester Community College, has built the program to the point of being designated a Center for Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense Education by the US Department of Homeland Security and the National Security Agency; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Watkins has provided his students with opportunities to participate in internships and cyber-competitions, acquire certifications, and engage in an extensive hands-on learning approach in the classroom; and

WHEREAS, the alumni of Mr. Watkins' program speak highly of his efforts in preparing them for careers in Cybersecurity, citing their internships, classroom experience, and job placements; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Watkins has exhibited an indefatigable enthusiasm for growing the Cybersecurity program and preparing his students for careers in this field vital to our nation's growth and security.

Community College Innovation Award – SUNY Westchester Community College

WHEREAS, New York Community College Trustees invites nominations to honor innovative Community Colleges for its Annual Awards Presentation taking place on Friday, September 23, 2022; and

WHEREAS, research has shown that high stakes single measure placement exams have significantly under-placed students, leading them to enroll in developmental education and impacting their ability to succeed; and

WHEREAS, the onset of the pandemic and the resultant move to remote operations required an alternative assessment and placement approach since the existing sources for Multiple Measures would not be available; and

WHEREAS, SUNY Westchester Community College (SUNY WCC) decided to forge ahead with its student success innovations and implemented its Directed Self-Placement (DSP) questionnaires; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of Multiple Measures and DSP has resulted in higher percentages of Black and Latino students placing into gateway math and English courses as well as improved success rates in these courses among these populations; and WHEREAS, the implementation of the DSP has coincided with a drastic decrease in equity gaps, with the placement rates for math of Black students increasing from 46.0% to 66.7% compared to the overall rates of 59.7% to 72.2%; and

WHEREAS, the percent of incoming students who pass a college level math course by the end of their first term has increased from 23% to 30% and the success rate in English has remained relatively flat even though the share of students being placed in these courses has increased; and

WHEREAS, SUNY WCC has been invited to present at several SUNY Strong Start to Finish workshops and the SUNY Student Success Summit, as well as the American Association of Colleges and Universities national conference and the Community College Showcase. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Trustees nominate SUNY WCC for the New York Community College Trustees Community College Innovation Award. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Board Secretary shall transmit this resolution and corresponding nomination to the New York Community College Trustees.
