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MISSION STATEMENT

Westchester Community College provides accessible, high quality and affordable education to meet the needs of our diverse community. We are committed to student success, academic excellence, workforce development, economic development and lifelong learning.

THE GRADUATES OF 2015

The 2014-2015 Study of the Graduates of Westchester Community College provides information about the 2015 graduating class in two ways. First, it profiles the demographic, educational, and work-related characteristics of these graduates. Then, it compares actual graduates to respondents demographically. These evaluations are a valuable tool used by the faculty and administrators of the College for planning and assessment purposes. Westchester Community College strives to provide quality services and instruction to our students.

METHODOLOGY

In Fall 2015, a survey (see Appendix 7) was sent to students who graduated from Westchester Community College either in Summer 2014, Fall 2014, and Spring 2015, otherwise considered the graduating Class of 2015.

Of the 1,654 students who graduated in the Class of 2015 (1,522 with Associate Degrees and 132 with Certificates); a total of 611 returned a completed survey. This yielded a sample size of 36.9%. We are grateful to these students for their cooperation. All the survey responses are self-reported by graduate respondents.

A comparison of the respondents to the known demographic characteristics of the entire 2015 graduating class shows similar percentages with regard to ethnic background, gender, and residence. For example, 41.9% of the respondents are White while White students comprise 40.8% of the actual graduating class; 20.3% of the respondents are Black compared to 18.7% of the actual graduating class; and 24.7% of the respondents are Hispanic compared to 29.2% of the actual graduating class. With regard to gender, 41.2% of the respondents are male while male comprised 44.4% of the actual graduating class, and 58.8% of the respondents are female while female comprised 55.6% of the actual 2015 graduating class. Three-fourths (75.4%) of the respondents live in Westchester County, while 76.8% of the actual class live in Westchester County.


In certain instances, the total number of students responding to a question does not add up to the total number who returned the survey (611). This is due to the fact that some respondents failed to answer a question or responded to a question that was not applicable to their current status. In these cases, we have used the actual number of respondents.

DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE OF ENTIRE CLASS OF 2015

Gender: Over half (55.6%) of the graduating Class of 2015 are female, as shown in Table I. This represents a slight increase from the previous year.




Age: Of the 2015 graduates, 4.2% were under 22 years of age at the time of graduation which was lower than the Class of 2014 (18.4%), as shown in Table II. The percentage of students graduating between the ages of 22 and 29 increased from (55.5%) in 2014 to (69.2%) in 2015.

2015 GRADUATES BY AGE




Ethnic Background: As shown in Table III, slightly more than two-fifths of the graduating Class of 2015 are White (40.8%), 18.7% are Black, 29.2% are Hispanic, and 5.0% are Asian.


GRADUATES BY ETHNIC BACKGROUND – 2015



Degrees: Almost two-fifths of the 2015 graduating class (39.7%) received an AAS degree. The AAS degree continues to be the top degree awarded. About one-third (32.2%) graduated with an AA degree, and one-fifth (20.2%) received an AS degree. The percentage of students receiving a certificate decreased to 8.0% from 9.8%.

TABLE IV: GRADUATES BY DEGREE: 2011-2015




GRADUATES BY DEGREE: 2011-2015




SURVEY RESPONSES OF 2015 GRADUATES

Residence of our Respondents: Of the respondents who reported where they live, three-fourths (75.4% or 450 graduates) reported living in Westchester County. Over one-fifth (21.6% or 129 graduates) reported living in New York State, but outside Westchester County bringing the total percentage of those living in New York State to 97.0%. Another 3.0% or 18 graduates reported living outside New York State.



Location of Employment: Of the 2015 respondents who reported the location of their employment, over two-thirds (68.0% or 274 graduates) reported working in Westchester County. One-fourth (24.8% or 100 graduates) reported working in New York State, but outside Westchester County bringing the total percentage of those working in New York State to 92.8%. Another 7.2% or 29 graduates reported working outside New York State.

LOCATION OF EMPLOYMENT OF 2015 RESPONDENTS




The Class of 2015 survey results show 26.2% employed in the job related to their degree or certificate. As shown in Table VII, 43.0% of the 2015 graduates reported being employed in the job that do not relate to their degree or certificate.

TABLE VII: EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF 2015 RESPONDENTS


EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF 2015 RESPONDENTS

SELF-EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF 2015 RESPONDENTS






TABLE VIII: EDUCATIONAL STATUS OF 2015 RESPONDENTS

Location of Colleges: Of the 2015 respondents who reported the location of their colleges, two-fifths (40.1% or 160 graduates) reported attending colleges in Westchester County. Over half (51.1% or 204 graduates) reported attending in New York State, but outside Westchester County bringing the total percentage of those attending colleges in New York State to 91.2%. Another 8.8% or 35 graduates reported attending colleges outside New York State.

EVALUATION OF COLLEGE EXPERIENCES

The 2015 respondents to the survey continue to give a positive response on several broad questions concerning Westchester Community College as shown in Table IX.

Educational Goals: In evaluating educational goals, the majority of respondents (92.3%) stated that their experience in *educational goals* were *very effective* or *effective*.


Academic Goals: In evaluating academic goals, the majority of respondents (92.4%) stated that their experience in *academic goals* were *very effective* or *effective*.

Career Goals: In evaluating career goals, the majority of respondents (79.0%) stated that their experience in *career goals* were *very effective* or *effective*.

Overall Quality of Instruction:


With regard to the Overall Quality of Instruction, 92.7% reported being either very satisfied or satisfied.




LICENSED OR CERTIFIED EXAMS STATUS OF 2015 RESPONDENTS
