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# The 2021-2022 Graduate Report

The **2021-2022 Graduate Report** provides information about the 2021-2022 graduating class of SUNY Westchester Community College in two ways. First, it compares the demographics of the graduating class to those students who responded to the 2021-2022 Graduate Survey in the **Profile of the 2021-2022 Graduates**. Second, it examines the responses of the 2021-2022 Graduate Survey in the **2021-2022 Graduate Survey Analysis**.


# Methodology

The 2021-2022 Graduate Report examines the 1,475 students who graduated from Westchester Community College in Summer 2021, Fall 2021, and Spring 2022, otherwise considered the graduating class of 2022. Six months after the students graduated, they were sent an online survey regarding their time at SUNY WCC as well as their experiences after graduation. The online survey was left open for 3 months before the results were downloaded. This resulted in 235 completed surveys and a response rate of 15.9%. The survey results were merged with institutional data to provide insight into the representativeness of the survey respondents.


# Profile of the 2021-2022 Graduating Class

The Profile of the 2021-2022 Graduating Class uses institutional data to identify the demographic and academic attributes of the graduating class of 2022. This includes gender, race/ethnicity, age, residence, grade point average (GPA), and degree type. These attributes are compared to the subset of graduates who responded to the Graduate Survey to ensure the survey responses can be generalized to the entire graduating class.


*Gender:* The gender distribution for graduates and survey respondents were similar with female students outnumbering males in both categories. Additionally, females were more likely to have completed the survey than males.




*Race/Ethnicity:* Hispanic/Latino (40.0%) and White (32.3%) students made up the largest shares of graduates. These groups also made up the largest numbers of survey respondents, with 79 Hispanic/Latino (33.6%) and 75 White (31.9%) students, respectively.




*Age:* Almost two-fifths (39.7%) of graduates (585 of 1,475 students) and 29.8 percent of survey respondents (70 of 235 students) fell within the 21 to 24 age range. It is important to note that those in this category responded at a lower rate than their relative percentage among the graduates. Those in the *30-49* and *50 or older* categories were over-represented in the sample.




*Residence:* Of the 1,475 students who made up the graduating class of 2022, more than threequarters (77.8% or 1,148 students) resided in Westchester County. A similar percentage of graduate survey respondents (77.0%) also reported living in Westchester. Only a small percentage of graduates (1.8%) or respondents (2.1%) lived outside of New York State at the time they answered the survey.



*GPA:* The largest GPA category among the graduates was between 3.51 and 4.00 (34.1%), which also comprised the largest category among the survey respondents (39.6%). This category was also slightly over-represented among those who completed the survey compared to their relative percentage among the graduates.



**Degree Type:** Among survey respondents, those obtaining A.S. degrees (37.2%) made up the largest share of graduates, followed by A.A. degrees (27.9%) and A.A.S. degrees (27.1%). Certificates made up 10 percent or fewer of the credentials granted to both survey respondents and graduates. The percentages of respondents were well representative of those of the graduates within these programs.




# 2021-2022 Graduate Survey Analysis

The 2021-2022 Graduate Survey Analysis examines the responses to various questions from the Graduate Survey. The following data are self-reported and cannot be verified. Students who did not provide a response were omitted fom the analysis.


# Education

*Are you currently attending a college, university, or training program?* Nearly half (47.5%) of the respondents indicated that they were not attending a college, university, or training program. More than two-fifths (44.1%) responded that they were attending a 4-year college or university.




Are you attending that college, university, or training program (full- or part-time): Of those who


indicated that they were enrolled in another higher educational institution, more than three-quarters (77.7%) were attending full-time.



*Please tell us where that college, university, or training program is located.* Nearly half (48.3%) of those enrolled in a college, university, or training program after graduating from SUNY WCC were attending classes outside Westchester County but in New York State. A slightly smaller percentage (40.8%) were enrolled at another institution in Westchester.




*To what extent do you feel that SUNY WCC prepared you for future study?* More than threequarters (76.0%) of survey respondents felt that SUNY WCC made them *well prepared* for further study. An additional 21.5 percent believed that the College made them *somewhat prepared* for future academic work.



# **Student Satisfaction**


*How satisfied were you with SUNY WCC in achieving your goals?* Students identified that they were either *satisfied* or *very satisfied* with SUNY WCC in helping them achieve their goals, particularly in regard to helping them achieve their academic (94.0%) and personal (93.6%) ambitions. Students were slightly less satisfied with the College in aiding them in attaining their career (86.6%) and social (81.1%) objectives.



*How satisfied were you with the following services?* Students responded with a high level of satisfaction with all services in the survey. The services with the strongest levels of satisfaction (either *very satisfied* or *satisfied*) were the Children's Center(97.1%), Library (96.8%), and Computer Services/Labs (94.2%). Even though all services were rated strongly, the following services were rated lower than the rest: Career Services (81.4%), Scholarships (83.5%), and Dining Services (85.7%).



*Percentage of students indicating they did not use various College services:* Many of the students surveyed reported that they did not use various services of the College. The services that had the highest percentages of nonuse were the Children's Center (82.7%), Recreational and Athletic (74.7%), and Disability Services (72.0%).



### How satisfied were you with the following at SUNY WCC (does not include N/A responses)?


Respondents were most satisfied with SUNY WCC aiding them in increasing their reading skills (95.4%), followed by achieving a degree/certificate for their present or future job (95.2%), and overall experiences with courses in their major (95.0%). Students felt satisfied, but less so, with the social climate (88.6%), transfering to a four-year institution (89.5%) and developing skills to express themselves orally (91.4%).




# Obstacles

### *Did you face any obstacles that impacted your ability to graduate from SUNY WCC?* More than

one-quarter (28.1%) of all students indicated that they faced obstacles that impacted their ability to graduate from SUNY WCC.




*What obstacles did you face throughout your time at SUNY WCC (check all that apply)?* Of those who expressed that they faced obstacles that impacted their ability to finish their program, the most common were the COVID-19 pandemic (64.3%), family or personal reasons (42.9%), and difficulty paying for school (41.1%).




### What College services helped you persist despite these obstacles (select all that apply)? The

College services that were most cited by the students as having aided them in persisting despite the obstacles that they faced included Financial Aid (40.8%), Mental Health and Counseling Services (22.5%), Student Involvement (22.5%), and Student Support Services (22.5%).




# **Campus Activities**

*Did you participate in any campus activities outside the classroom during your time at SUNY WCC? Campus activities include the Involvement Fair, Meeting the Firm Series, Viking Rainbow Pride, Make or Take events, etc.:* More thank three-quarters (77.5%) indicated that they did not participate in campus activities outside the classroom while students at SUNY WCC.




*How important were campus activities outside the classroom in:* The overwhelming majority of students who participated in campus activities responded that they were either *very important* or *important* in helping them connect with their peers (86.3%), helping them to develop transferable skills (75.0%), and feeling more connected to the SUNY WCC community (75.0%).




# Scholarships

*Did you receive a private scholarship while you attended SUNY WCC?* Of the respondents to the survey, 17.3 percent indicated that they received a private scholarship while attending the College and 13.7 percent were unsure.




*How impactful was the scholarship you received in graduating from SUNY WCC?* Nearly threequarters (74.3%) of those who answered the survey and have received a private scholarship indicated that it was *very impactful*. An additional 20.0 percent indicated that it was either *impactful* or *somewhat impactful*. In the open-ended responses, many students indicated that they would not have been able to graduate on time without the financial assistance that the scholarships provided.




# Employment

*What is your employment status?* Nearly one-third (32.6%) of survey respondents were employed, either full- or part-time, in a job related to their degree/certificate (65 of 199) compared to 37.7 percent (75 of 199) who reported careers unrelated to their training. Additionally, 19.1 percent of the respondents (38 of 199) were not employed, but were seeking employment.




Is this your first professional position obtained after earning your degree? For most students


(59.7%) their current job was not the first professional position they obtained after receiving their degree (80 out of 134).



*Where is your employer located?* Most (59.4%) of the respondents (79 of 133) were employed within Westchester County. Slightly more than one in ten (12.0%) were employed outside New York State (16 of 133). The most common place of employment listed among the respondents was Westchester Medical Center (8).




*What is your current salary range?* More than two-fifths (40.5%) of the respondents (53 of 131) reported earning below \$30,000 a year in their current profession. Approximately an equal percentage (42.0%) earned \$40,000 or more (55 of 131).




To what extent do you feel your SUNY WCC education prepared you for your current job? More

than four out of five (82.7%) survey respondents felt that their experiences at SUNY WCC enabled them to be *well prepared* or *somewhat prepared* for their current job (110 of 133).



*Are you satisfied with your current job?* The overwhelming majority (85.7%) of those who responded to this question were either *very satisfied* or *satisfied* with their current job (114 of 133 respondents).



# Conclusion

The information presented above can be used by the faculty, staff, and administrators of the College to identify areas for improvement. It can be a valuable tool for assessment of academic programs, College services, and College processes, and can provide a starting point for future analyses.
