

2024 Native Woody of the Year



Cornus florida Flowering dogwood

A small deciduous tree that provides year-round interest. Broad white flowers (bracts) in spring followed by bright-red fruit relished by birds. Stunning fall foliage and beautiful branch structure in winter.

Hardiness: Zones 5-9

Light: Sun to part shade

Soil: Average Size: 15–30' tall

Foliage: Green, turns red-purple

in fall

Flowers: Showy white bracts

Fruit: Red berries

Bloom Time: April to May

Wildlife Value: Bees and butterflies feed from the flowers; birds feed on the

berries.
