

2021 Native Woody of the Year

Physocarpus opulifolius Common ninebark

Dense, fast-growing deciduous shrub with arching branches. Striking white to pink spiraea-like blooms in May–June. Exfoliating bark adds winter interest. Use as hedge for screening. Many cultivars of varied leaf colors available. Withstands tough sites. Of special value to native bees.

Hardiness: Zones 2–8

Light: Sun to part shade

Soil: Moist to dry Size: 4–8' tall

Foliage: Shallow lobed; cultivars

offer varied colors

Flowers: 5-petaled in showy round

clusters of white to pink

Fruit: Reddish dried seed clusters

Bloom Time: May to June

Wildlife Value: Nectar attracts bees and butterflies; seeds attract birds.
