VP Cantú, who joined SUNY Westchester earlier this year, has hit the ground running: Within the first 90 days of his appointment, he met with over 100 stakeholders across the college community. This included personal visits to the Peekskill, Ossining, Yonkers, and Mt. Vernon extension centers.

"SUNY Westchester is an absolute gem and the primary source for higher education for Westchester County residents," says VP Cantú. "Our mission is vitally important to so many, which is why it's incumbent upon us that we remain aligned with the needs of our current and future students. That's why one of my goals for my first year is to do all I can to help strengthen the close connections between the college and the County's K-12 schools."

VP Cantú is an accomplished postsecondary leader. Over his nearly 20-year career in higher education, he has provided administrative leadership in enrollment management, academic affairs, and student affairs. He acknowledges, however, that his approach is influenced by his early career in industry and his subsequent work in the non-profit sector. "Constant alignment and adaptation is baked into my DNA."

He has experienced, first-hand, how a student can start at a community college and go just about anywhere, whether that involves improved workforce opportunities upon completing a 2-year degree or the pursuit of additional postsecondary education at a four-year college. "The affordable, high-quality education that WCC offers is second to none," he said. "In addition to our curricular core, our Viking ROADS program is receiving national recognition by helping more students succeed, we've doubled our graduation rates, we have a high-quality Honors program, engaging student leadership and career readiness programming, and so much more."

VP Cantú says that the SUNY WCC student experience, supported by the collective efforts of so many at the institution, is designed to help students develop skills for college and career. "It's no real mystery why WCC is recognized as an engine of upward mobility for so many County residents."

Taking Steps Toward Successful Enrollment

<u>Applying to WCC</u>: Students are encouraged to apply online as soon as possible at <u>www.sunywcc.edu/apply</u>. Admissions letters are being mailed to students applying for the Fall 2024 term (which begins in September 2024). A series of emails from the college's automated CRM communication system will follow guiding students through their next steps in the enrollment process. Please ask your students to check their emails regularly for updates after they apply.



<u>How Can Students Waive the \$50 Application Fee</u>? Students who financially qualify for free or reduced-price lunch programs, whose household income does not exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, or are from foster families are automatically eligible for an application fee waiver! By completing the SUNY Westchester Community College online application at <u>www.sunywcc.edu/apply</u> and answering the targeted questions to identify in one of the above mentioned categories, the \$50 application fee will automatically be waived upon submission. Other ways to waive the \$50 application fee include attending one of our Admissions Information Sessions or attending an Application Day hosted by a SUNY WCC Admissions Counselor at the high school! Let's Get Started Module

SUNY Westchester Community College's commitment to our access mission and the success of our newly admitted students is demonstrated in the rollout of our new--as of Summer 2023--Let's Get Started! module for all matriculated new students. We recognize that our students come to us from different backgrounds and experiences and with multiple starting points; as such, we designed this module to provide critical information that all new students need to know, while also providing embedded options for new students to select specialized information that applies to them. Coming to college from high school, whether a student graduated this year or many years ago, can be a daunting experience for new students—especially those who are the first in their family to attend college. On top of that, there is a lot of new information for these students to learn, many steps they must take in order to successfully register and pay for their classes, and multiple offices with which they must interact for placement, document submission, class selection, registration, payment and so on. The new Let's Get Started! module makes information accessible and provides needed communications in just one place. Furthermore, necessary instructions, web links, secure document upload links and the like are at the new students' fingertips; a single click will take them to where they need to go, thus eliminating the need for multiple online searches and thereby reducing new student frustration.

All matriculated new students are required to complete the Let's Get Started! module online before they may move forward in the enrollment and registration processes. New students will need to activate their MyWCC student portal to complete the new module, where they will receive information on important steps they need to take--like submitting transcripts, applying for financial aid, etc.--and will even receive a system-generated certificate upon successful completion of the Let's Get Started! module. In addition, and as part of this new process, placement surveys will be automatically requested upon completion of the module, which will then be sent to new students' @my.sunywcc.edu email addresses only. Of course, we are here to help any incoming new student who might have questions about, or need help with, completing the Let's Get Started! module. TRIO Student Support Services

At SUNY WCC, TRIO offers support to 170 eligible students. The goal of TRIO SSS is to increase the retention, graduation, and transfer of student participants.

- Meet at least <u>one</u> of the following criteria: You are a first-generation college student (neither parent has a four-year degree), have a documented disability and/or family meets federal TRIO income eligibility requirements
- A U.S. Citizen or permanent resident

We believe that a first-class experience entails faculty who are experienced professionals and are passionate about developing and teaching cutting edge curriculum.





The School of Mathematics, Science and Engineering at WCC offers associate in science programs and associate in applied sciences in Engineering and Technology. The AS and AAS programs are available in Civil, Electrical and Mechanical disciplines. These programs are led by experts who have real-world experience and teach in demand topics in their respective fields. They bring a wealth of knowledge and practical insight to the classroom, ensuring that students are equipped with the skills needed to excel in their careers. Electrical labs offer circuit analysis and design equipment, such as breadboard, soldier stations, digital multimeters, oscilloscopes, solar panels, energy management and storage controls and wind turbines. Health Studies A.S.

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Community Health & Case Management Certificate

We love introducing students to the vast opportunities that exist within the health care industry. Our 62-credit program prepares them for transfer to bachelor degrees and to seek careers in the health care workforce.

It is never too early to start considering a career in health care. This past summer we offered our course called Exploring Health Careers to high school students at our Peekskill Extension Center earning them college credits.

We also offer a 28-credit Community Health and Case Management Certificate that prepares students to work on the frontline in the fields of public health, health care, social work and human services. The certificate includes courses and fieldwork where students learn to apply their knowledge and skills in real work environments. Those who complete their certificate and decide to continue their studies may transfer their completed course credits into the Health Studies A.S., or Human Services A.S.

In collaboration with Workforce Development Community Education, we are working on creating a pathway for students enrolled in non-credit health care-related programs to easily move into the credit-bearing Community Health and Case Management Certificate and the Health Studies A.S.

Digital Filmmaking

As you can see from the credits at the end of a movie, there are hundreds of talented people working hard at every stage of a film's production process. In New York especially, there are countless opportunities to work in those roles, and many WCC students are preparing to do just that.

The Department of Film offers two degrees in Digital Filmmaking, the Associate of Science, which typically precedes transfer to a four-year college, and the Certificate, which prepares students to work in film or related fields soon after graduation. All Digital Filmmaking students learn how to

- Plan, shoot, and edit a short film.
- Craft a cinematic story with a coherent narrative structure.
- Understand, appreciate and analyze film as an art form.
- Use current software such as Final Cut Pro and Adobe After Effects.
- Work effectively as individuals and as members of a team.

Graduates of our program have transferred to a wide range of four-year colleges, such as Pace University, Brooklyn College, Binghamton University, and NYU Tisch. Some have won film festival prizes or fellowships; become Pulitzer Reporting Fellows, worked on TV shows such as "Pretty Little Liars: Summer School" and "Law and Order," or been selected for the Directors' Guild of America Assistant Director Training Program.

The skills and competencies developed in our major can also be used in many fields outside the film industry, such as business, education, and retail. The Bureau of Labor Statistics' Occupational Outlook Handbook reveals that "employment in media and communication occupations is projected to grow 14 percent from 2020 to 2030," so it is a great time to study film!

By enrolling in one of the Digital Filmmaking Programs at WCC, you will join a community of creative, talented and passionate people, including the students in our thriving Film Club, and our instructors who are awardwinning screenwriters, producers, editors, location managers, programmers, curators, and authors of scholarly film books. You will gain access to a Mac lab with editing software and camera, sound, and lighting equipment. Maybe you will even show your work in our annual Student Film Festival!

We are excited to welcome you to the next generation of digital storytellers.

International Students will need to fill out a Scholarship Financial Need Application (F-1, Other Visa holders).

Priority deadline for filing Financial Aid forms to be considered for a WCC Foundation Scholarship for New students is April 15th for the fall semester! This process will allow the college to provide students with a comprehensive financial assistance package in a timelier manner.
