

2019 Native Perennial of the Year



Veronicastrum virginicum Culver's root

Dramatic spikes of white flowers rise above whorled foliage in July and August. Striking vertical architecture provides back-ofthe-border drama. Useful in rain gardens. Threatened in NY.

Hardiness: Light:	Zones 3–8 Sun
Soil:	Moist to average
Size:	4–6' tall
Foliage:	Dark green, lance-shaped; in whorls
Flowers:	Spikes of white clusters
Bloom Time: Summer	
Wildlife Value: Of special value to native	
bees; attracts butterflies
