Early College Experience (ECE)

The Early College Experience Program is an academic partnership between Westchester Community College and local high schools, which gives students the opportunity to enroll in college-level classes and earn college credits in high school.



Take College Courses While in High School

To participate, students must be on track to meet New York State graduation requirements and complete all necessary prerequisites for the college courses. All classes take place in the high school during the students' regular school day.



Transfer College Credits

Students who complete all required coursework receive a grade recorded on the official Westchester Community College transcript. These credits can be used toward a Westchester Community College degree or can be sent to another college or university for transfer credit evaluation.
