Did You Know?

- SUNY WCC offers more than 58 certificate and associate programs in a wide range of disciplines and is the largest educational institution in Westchester.
- SUNY Westchester Community College has the fourth-highest credit enrollment and the highest non-credit enrollment among SUNY community colleges, and ranks second in fall-to-fall student retention at 68.1% among the system's 30 community colleges.
- Credit, ESL, workforce training, and enrichment courses are offered at the Valhalla main campus, four extension centers—Mount Vernon, Ossining, Peekskill, and Yonkers—and additional instructional locations.
- The WCC Foundation consistently ranks among the highest SUNY community colleges for overall fundraising and awards more than \$3 million in student scholarships, and an additional \$2 - \$3 million in college program support annually.
- Over 600 dedicated volunteers enrich the student experience through mentoring, community classes, tutoring, and campus beautification.

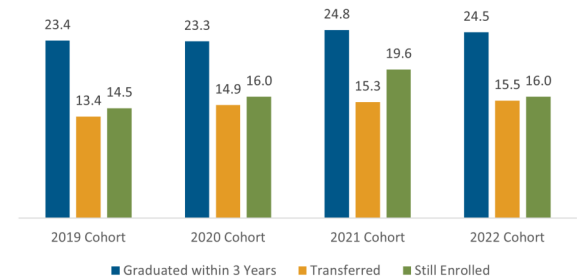
