College of New Rochelle is a private institution that was founded in 1904 as the first Catholic college for women in New York State. It has a suburban setting. It utilizes a semester-based academic calendar. The College of New Rochelle enrolls nearly 4,200 students on six campuses across the Greater New York City area. College of New Rochelle's ranking in the 2013 edition of Best Colleges is Regional Universities (North), Tier 2. Their academic programs are offered in four schools -- the School of Arts & Sciences (for women), School of New Resources (for adults), School of Nursing, and their Graduate School. The student-faculty ratio at College of New Rochelle is 15:1. College of New Rochelle is part of the NCAA III athletic conference.

General stipulations at a glance:

- **WCC AA, or AS degree graduates in specified programs with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 will be granted junior status at The College of New Rochelle**

- **WCC AAS in Human Services degree graduates with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 will be granted junior status at The College of New Rochelle in the BS in Social work program.**
- **WCC AAS degree graduates will be deemed to have fulfilled all General Education requirements, provided they have completed at least one credit bearing Mathematics course with a grade "C-" or better and a ENG 102 course with a grade "C" or better**
- **All courses transferred will receive full credit as awarded by WCC**
- **WCC transferring students with a GPA or 2.5 or higher will be eligible for a merit scholarship**
