Mount St. Mary College is a private institution that was founded in 1959. It has a total undergraduate enrollment of 2,347, with a gender distribution of 26.9 percent male students and 73.1 percent female students. Its setting is suburban, and the campus size is 86 acres. It utilizes a semester-based academic calendar. Mount St. Mary College's ranking in the 2013 edition of Best Colleges is Regional Universities (North), 124. The student-faculty ratio at Mount St. Mary College is 15:1, and the school has 47.2 percent of its classes with fewer than 20 students. The most popular majors at Mount St. Mary College include: Health Professions and Related Programs; Business, Management, Marketing, and Related Support Services; History; Psychology; and Social Sciences. At this school, 44.0 percent of the students live in college-owned, -operated, or -affiliated housing and 56.0 percent of students live off campus. Mount St. Mary College is part of the NCAA III athletic conference

## **General stipulations at a glance:**

- **WCC AA, or AS degree graduates in the specified programs and with a cumulative GPA of 2.00 will be granted junior status at Mount Saint Mary College in Newburgh, New York.**
- **Upon transferring, WCC graduates with an AA or AS will be awarded a minimum of 60 credits and up to a maximum of 66 credits earned at WCC as applicable to programs at Mount Saint Mary College.**
- **Courses transferred will receive full credit as awarded by WCC even if the equivalent Mount Saint Mary College course award is a different number of credits. If the MSMC course awards fewer credits than the WCC course, MSMC will award either elective credit in the major or blanket elective credits for the residue credits.**
- **A grade of “D” is acceptable only with the 60 credit guarantee for completed AA or AS degree or for the first part of sequential subjects in which a grade of “C” or better is achieved in the second class (e.g. BIO 1130:D; BIO 1140: C).**
