SUNY Maritime College is a public institution that was founded in 1874. It has a total undergraduate enrollment of 1,661, with a gender distribution of 88.8 percent male students and 11.2 percent female students. Its setting is urban, and the campus size is 55 acres. It utilizes a semester-based academic calendar. SUNY Maritime College's ranking in the 2013 edition of Best Colleges is Regional Colleges (North), 17. The student-faculty ratio at SUNY Maritime College is 14:1, and the school has 46.4 percent of its classes with fewer than 20 students. Maritime College offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in the following areas: Engineering (Marine, Mechanical, Electrical and Facilities), Naval Architecture, Marine Transportation/ Business Administration(minors in Ship Management and Maritime & Port Security), Maritime Studies, Marine Environmental Science (minors in Marine Biology and Meteorology & Oceanography), Humanities, International Transportation and Trade, and a Master's degree in International Transportation Management. At this school, 78.0 percent of the students live in college-owned, -operated, or -affiliated housing and 22.0 percent of students live off campus. SUNY Maritime College is part of the NCAA III athletic conference
