# **Graduate Report**

Profile of the Graduates and Graduate Survey Analysis



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#### The 2015-2016 Graduate Report

The **2015-2016 Graduate Report** provides information about the 2015-2016 graduating class of Westchester Community College in two ways. First, it compares the demographics of the graduating class to those students who responded to the 2015-2016 Graduate Survey in the **Profile of the 2015-2016 Graduates**. Secondly, it examines the responses of the 2015-2016 Graduate Survey in the **2015-2016 Graduate Survey Analysis**.


#### Methodology

The 2015-2016 Graduate Report examines the 1,856 students who graduated from Westchester Community College either in Summer 2015, Fall 2015, and Spring 2016, otherwise considered the graduating class of 2016. Six months after the students graduated, they were sent an online survey regarding their time at WCC as well as their experiences after graduation. The online survey was left open for 3 months before the results were downloaded. This resulted in 669 completed surveys which yielded a response rate of 36.0%. The survey results were merged with institutional data to provide insight into the representativeness of the survey respondents.


## **Profile of the 2015-2016 Graduating Class**

The Profile of the 2015-2016 Graduating Class uses institutional data to identify the demographic attributes and academic attributes of the graduating class of 2016. This includes gender, race/ethnicity, age, residence, GPA, and degree type. These attributes are compared to the subset of graduates who responded to the Graduate Survey to ensure the survey responses can be generalized to the entire graduating class.


**Gender:** The gender distribution for survey respondents and graduates were similar, with female students outnumbering male students. Of the 1,856 graduates, 1,035 (55.8%) identified as female, compared to 419 of the 669 (62.6%) survey respondents.




**Race/Ethnicity:** White students made up the largest share of graduates with 669 students, followed by 611 Hispanic/Latino students. White student and Hispanic/Latino students made up equal shares of survey respondents, with 209 students in each group.




*Age:* Most survey respondents (257 of 669 students) and graduates (812 of 1,856 students) fell within the 21 to 24 age range. There were much fewer students of each group in the 50 or older category.




**Residence:** Of the 1,856 students that made up the graduating class of 2016, 1,427 (76.9%) resided in Westchester County. A similar percentage of respondents resided in Westchester County. Less than 1 percent of respondents and graduates lived outside of New York State.



**GPA:** About one-third of graduates and survey respondents finished their time at WCC with a GPA between 3.01 and 3.50. About one quarter of survey respondents and graduates finished with a GPA over 3.51.



**Degree Type:** The overwhelming majority of credentials received by the graduating class of 2016 were Associate degrees (1,731), specifically A.A.S. degrees (698). Certificates made up less than 10 percent of the credentials granted to both survey respondents and graduates.




### **2015-2016 Graduate Survey Analysis**

The 2015-2016 Graduate Survey Analysis examines the responses to various questions from the Graduate Survey. The following data is self-reported and cannot be verified. Students who did not provide a response are ommitted from the analysis.


Effectiveness of WCC Experience at Achieving Goals: Graduates generally felt their experience at WCC was effective at achieving their career, personal, academic, and educational goals. Specifically, about 95 percent of respondents felt the WCC experience was effective or very effective in achieving their educational goals. While the majority of students felt the same about their career goals, almost 20 percent felt that their WCC experience was ineffective or very ineffective at achieving their career goals.




**Satisfaction with Education at WCC:** Graduates reported high levels of satisfaction with their courses, quality of instruction, and college experience. In each area over 90 percent of graduates selected either satisfied or very satisfied.




**Pursuit of Additional Education and/or Transfer after Graduating from WCC:** Of the 657 graduates who responded to this question, 462 (70.3%) reported they pursued additional education and/or transfer after graduating from WCC.




**Location of Current Educational Institution:** Out of the students who reported pursuing additional education or transferring to another institution, the majority were enrolled in institutions that were outside of Westchester County but in New York.



**Current Employment Status:** Almost three-quarters of survey respondents were employed, most of whom were in jobs that were not related to their career/certificate. About 15 percent of respondents were unemployed but looking for employment when they responded to the survey.



**Location of Current Employment:** The overwhelming majority of graduates who were employed were working in Westchester County. Only about 7 percent of those who were employed were not working in New York.



#### **Conclusion**

The information presented above can be used by the faculty and administrators of the College to identify areas for improvement. It can be a valuable tool for assessment of academic programs, college services, and college processes, and can provide a starting point for future analyses.
