

WCC STUDENT SUCCESS RATE

BASED ON CALCULATIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE
STUDENT RIGHT TO KNOW ACT

FALL 2015 COHORT

Under the guidelines set forth by the federal *Student Right to Know Act*, the graduation rate for first-time, full-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students in the Fall 2015 at Westchester Community College is **18.3%**.

The success rate for students recognizes that many students come to the community college with the intent of transferring before degree completion or may take longer to graduate. With these factors in mind, the success rate for the fall 2015 cohort is **55.5%**.

They include those who were: (1) first-time undergraduate students in Fall 2015; (2) attended full-time (12 credits or more); (3) were enrolled in an associate degree or certificate program in Fall 2015; and (4) graduated or transferred to another college within 150% of normal time (Fall 2018). Not included are undergraduate students who transferred in to WCC in Fall 2015, non-matriculated students, and students attending part-time
